WORTHING PUB GETS IN A SPIN FOR CHARITY

A Worthing pub is hosting a casino evening in June to raise funds for a West Sussex charity.

The Richard Cobden Public House in Cobden Road is putting on the event to support the Worthing-based Independent Living Association (ILA) which helps hundreds of disabled people to organise and run their own care so they can live independently in their own homes.

Tickets for the event, from 7.30-11.30pm on Saturday 2 June, can be bought in advance from the pub. The £10 entry fee includes a buffet and a free drink on arrival.

Pub landlady Erika Davies said: "It promises to be a great night so we're keen to encourage people to come along and join us to play roulette and watch our roving magician while raising some money for this very good cause.

"The pub will be decorated in a 1930s speakeasy theme so we'd like people to get into the spirit of things by dressing accordingly. And for those who don't want to do fancy dress, we're asking them to choose clothes with a black and white theme."

Funds raised from the casino evening will be used to purchase computers for disabled people so that they can access information and support from their homes.
